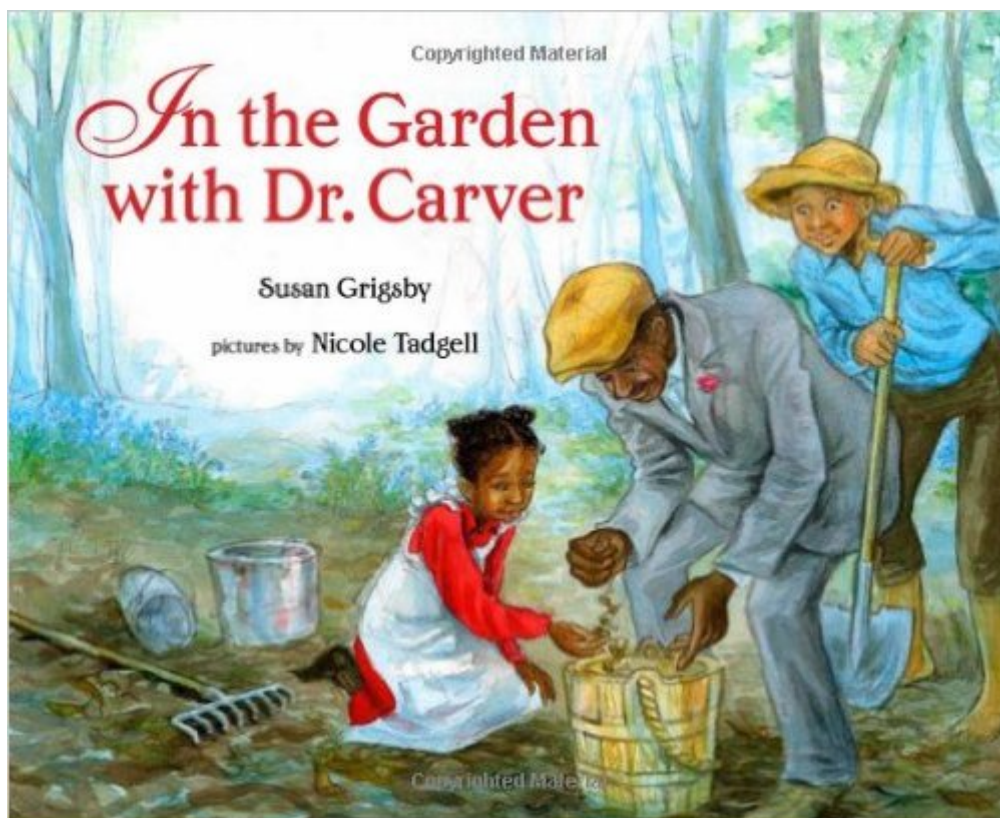

Botanist and inventor George Washington Carver achieved professional acclaim with his scholarship in plant pathology and agriculture at the Tuskegee Institute in Alabama. His strong desire to use hands-on methods in teaching farmers and mentoring children led him to travel across the South in a wagon specially equipped with extension materials and pulled by a mule. Carver's novel use of the movable school contributed to improved understanding of how alternative crops such as peanuts and sweet potatoes could improve soil quality and diversify people's diets. As a highly educated and successful African American scientist, he also served as an important role

model for children at a time of rampant discrimination and racial segregation. This work of historical fiction presents young learners with a snapshot of George Washington Carver's extension work with children. Although the text and illustrations have a botanical focus, the story can motivate some useful economics-oriented discussions related to natural resources, innovation, and agricultural production. As one of the most famous African American inventors in U.S. history, Carver has left a rich legacy that is clearly presented in this appealing children's book.

Children will enjoy going back in time to early 1900s in rural Alabama as they learn more about African American scientist George Washington Carver in the book *In the Garden With Dr. Carver* by Susan Grigsby. As Sally leaves church, she sees a man in a wagon. This was no ordinary wagon but an educational wagon ran by a man with most usual ideas about gardening. Since the area had been used to grow cotton for many years, nutrients in the soil were stripped away. As a result, people found it difficult to get food to grow in the soil. Dr. Carver teaches the adults and children how to replenish nutrients in the soil and other things about nature. Sally and her friends at school eat lunch made from items taken from the garden, including some created by Dr. Carver such as chicken derived from peanuts. Sally was thrilled to have met this man and treasured all the things she learned from him. Complete with rich illustrations, children will find *In the Garden With Dr. Carver* not only engaging but educational with the addition of information about the work of George Washington Carver as the book ends.
