

I was given this book as a baby gift because I grew up in Iowa. By reading this book, I learned things about the state that I never knew. For instance, I did not know that the American Gothic painting is really a farmer and his daughter. H is for Hawkeye will be a keepsake for my family. I will be able to show my son pictures of and information about the state I was raised in. I like the format with the simple rhymes and the additional paragraphs with more information about each letter's detail. The illustrations are very well done and appealing. I will be giving this book to several children this holiday season and I will be looking at other state alphabet books in this series. This is a wonderful way to teach history and geography of our great country.

What a delightful book! I love that the stories which correspond with each letter of the alphabet are filled with pertinent AND fun facts about Iowa. This book could be such a learning tool. The illustrations are quite beautiful and fully capture the spirit and charm of my home state. (I wouldn't be biased, now, would I?)

However, the persons in Grant Wood's American Gothic are his sister Nan and his dentist. Picture is on loan from the Chicago Art Institute to the Cedar Rapids [IA] Museum of Art this fall [2005.] Wood was a long-time teacher in the Cedar Rapids public schools.

I purchased this book as a Christmas gift for our exchange student from Taiwan. The photos are very beautiful, and had a lot of interesting tidbits. It was a wonderful way to share Iowa with our student. The only sad thing is that Maytag is no longer in Newton - they are now made in Mexico. :(At any rate - it will be fun to get him books on all the states that he has been to during his stay with us so he can share them with his friends and family back home.

I LOVE these state books and so does my 2 1/2 year old. We live in Georgia, but were given the Oregon book from friends who live there when my son was a baby. He loved it so much and it contains great information about the state....so I looked for one from Tennessee (my home state) and Iowa (his father's home state) and was able to find both. I was thrilled with the books. I even learned things about Tennessee and Iowa that I didn't know. The art is great for when they are young, but the book can grow to a teaching tool as they get older!

I was shopping for a children's book for a baby shower which requested a book for the baby to be. Being from Iowa and an avid Iowa Hawkeye fan I purchased this book.
